LATIN CLUB CORNER



IMPORTANT NOTICE - LB Camden Road Safety Officer & School Crossing Patrol Supervisor

Over the recent weeks we have seen an increase in dangerous driving and parking around the Primrose Hill School site. Please be aware that the parking restrictions around the school (including the Zig Zag lines) are in place to ensure the safety of pupils when travelling to and from school. We understand that some parents have to use cars, however we kindly request that once in the area you do not do any of the following —

<u>Please do not</u> double park vehicles as this reduces visibility for pedestrians and restricts traffic flow.

<u>Please do not park</u> on the Zig-Zag lines or any double yellow lines around the school.

<u>Please do not</u> park or drop off next to the diagonal parking bays near to the Lollipop Lady as this restricts the view for oncoming cars and her ability to see what's coming toward the crossing point.

<u>Please do not</u> park or drop off next to the School's double gates as this is the busiest area of footway and puts the children at risk.

We will continue to monitor the situation over the coming weeks and should these issues continue we will have to consider possible parking enforcement to ensure the area is safe.

We would like to thank you in advance for your help with these issues and please be assured that our number one priority is to ensure the children of Primrose Hill are safe when travelling to and from the school.
