

**Eid** is due to fall this year on **either Friday 17th or Saturday 18th July**. This is very close to the end of the school year but the local authority remind us that the position is clear—only one day should be authorised for Eid, and then only if taken on the official Eid day. All other leave appended to it, or taken under the auspices of an 'Eid day', would be unauthorised. If, however, Eid falls on Saturday, 18th July, then pupils would not be entitled to take any day off school as **Religious Observation.** 

School Meal Prices Camden Council has agreed to increase the price of school meals in primary and special schools from £2.16 to £2.30. The new price will take effect from September 2015. The meal price paid by you should have increased in April 2015, but the Council has been covering the increased cost until the end of this academic year. This increase is a result of the Council's policy on London Living Wage (LLW), which will now be paid to all the catering staff. This is to help ensure fair salaries and the wellbeing of school catering staff and their families. If you are eligible for free school meals, please make sure you are claiming your entitlement - if you think you qualify, please contact the school. If you are on Universal Free School Meals please also claim your entitlement since this will help with our budget.
