Free School Meals

We would like to remind you that if you are what the Government terms 'on a low income' your child qualifies for Free School Meals. Children do not have to take our meals if they don't want to but, if they are on our Free School Meals register, they may qualify for all sorts of other financial benefits throughout the year. When a child is on our Free School Meals register, the school receives £1,300 for each child. This money is called the Pupil Premium and its purpose is to ensure that children from low income families are not at a financial disadvantage during their education. You could be eligible for Free School Meals if you claim:

- Income support
- Income related employment and support allowance
- Income based job seekers allowance
- Child tax credit
- Guaranteed element of Pension Tax
 Credit or are
 an asylum seeker

CHILD TALK QUESTIONS

Many parents find that their child does not want to talk about what they did at school today. Below are some different ways to ask the question, "What did you do at school today". Many children are not ready to talk at pick-up time. You may want to wait until bath-time or bed-time to ask these questions :

Questions to ask your child:

- I. What was the best thing that happened at school today?
- 2. Tell me something that made you laugh today.
- 3. Tell me something good that happened today.
- 4. Where is the best place at school?
- 5. Tell me a weird word that you heard today.
- 6. If I called your teacher tonight what would she tell me about you?
- 7. How did you help somebody today?
- 8. How did somebody help you today?
- 9. Tell me one thing that you learned today.
- 10.. When were you the happiest today?
