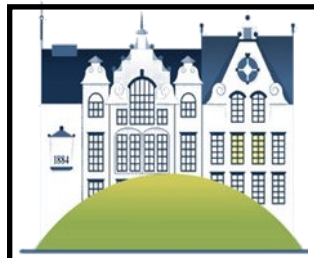

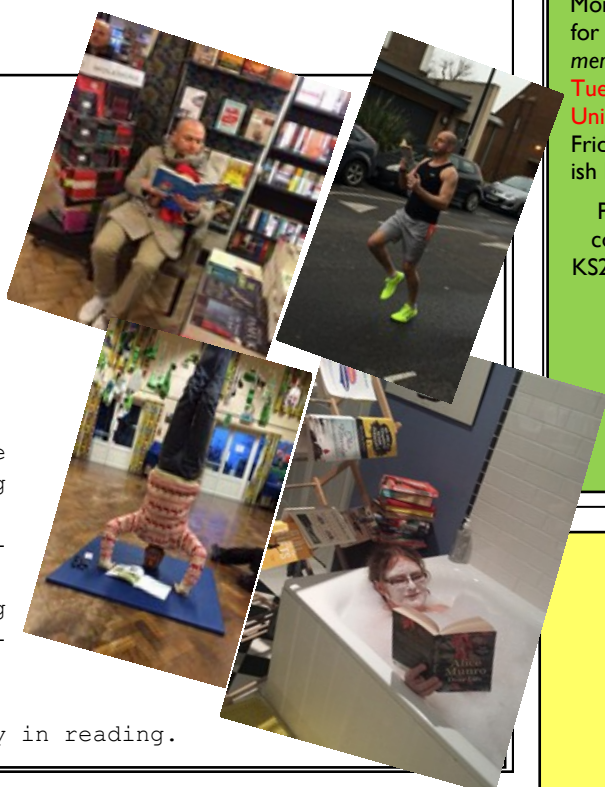


**EXTREME READING!!!**

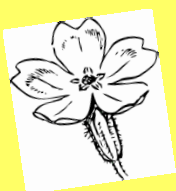


day we will be sharing our favourite reading experiences, photos and joy in reading.
