# Lunches

The new lunch menu is now out and on the website. We have a variety of mechanisms where children report positives and negatives to me about the lunch menu. I have communicated with Camden and Caterlink and there may be some adaptations to the vegetarian choices so they are more in line with what is being offered to meat eaters. I have also been in discussions with Camden about halal options....this is not as easy as it would appear as it involves investment in new cooking equipment to comply with recommendations. I am doing some more research into this. I am aware that there are only four other Camden Schools which offer a halal option and several who have halal food transported into them - this is something which will be probably phased out due to local authority budget cuts. In the meantime, our priority is ensuring the vegetarian options are high quality and give the children a comparable choice.
