A reminder about informing the school of children's absences. It is vital we know why your child is not in school so we can authorise any absence. If we do not have the reason, the child is given an unauthorised absence mark. If a child receives ten of these, then the local authority may issue a penalty notice. It is important to note that

if your child is absent for one day, this counts as TWO absences (morning and afternoon). You can call the school and leave a message on the answering machine Option I. We would also advise you to send an email to attendance@primrosehill.camden.sch.uk so we both have a paper record.
