

Measles The NHS have asked us to communicate that there have been an increasing number of measles outbreaks in London. It is important to spot the signs and symptoms which last up to 8 days :

- Irritability
- Runny nose
- Conjunctivitis or itchy eyes
- Cough
- Increasing fever that comes and goes
- Rash which usually starts on the forehead and spreads downwards

Please let the office know if your child has suspected measles. Children are infectious before the rash appears and for several

days after. They should not return to school until at least 4 days after their rash began. 🍕 Please speak to your doctor if your child has not had two doses of the MMR vaccine or if you are worried. For more information go to www.nhs.uk/Pages/HomePage.aspx

Y2 Morning Routine
