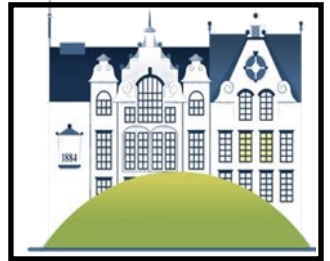

Mitzvah 365 is running a nappy drive to support refugees in Camden

The idea for the nappy drive is that parents bring extra nappies (size 5 and 6 specifically) from home, we create a big pile of collected nappies, and at the end, a volunteer parent will deliver the nappies to a local support centre for a simple and easy project, but a special one for the borough with.



The project will provide much needed nappies to the children of refugees and will run from between the 23rd May to June 12th. Nappies are a basic healthcare need that can be critical to protecting babies from the disease and illness that develop through lack of proper sanitation. If you can help, thank you.

Once collected, these nappies can then be taken to the local drop off point. We shall be talking to the FOPHS re collection from school.
