Primrose Hill Primary School Key Stage 2 SATS Information for Parents & Carers

As you will know, in the summer term 2017, children at the end of Key Stage 2 (Y6) will undergo the new Standardised Assessment Test (SATs) process. SATs were overhauled in both Key Stage I and Key Stage 2 last year to reflect the changes to the National Curriculum, which was introduced from September 2014.

SATS week is the week beginning Monday 8th May 2017.

The previous national curriculum levels were scrapped, and instead Y6 children will be given scaled scores. You will be given your child's raw score (the actual number of marks they get), alongside their scaled score and whether they have reached the national average. The score needed to reach the national average was a scaled score of 100 last year.

All children in Y6 across the country will go through the same process and be tested in:

- Reading
- Spelling, Punctuation & Grammar
- Maths

Reading

The reading test will be a single paper with questions based on three passages of text. Your child will have one hour, including reading time, to complete the test.

There will be a selection of question types, including:

- **Ranking/ordering**, e.g. 'Number the events below to show the order in which they happen in the story'
- Labelling, e.g. 'Label the text to show the title of the story'
- **Find and copy**, e.g. 'Find and copy one word that suggests what the weather is like in the story'
- Short constructed response, e.g. 'What does the bear eat?'
- **Open-ended response**, e.g. 'Look at the sentence that begins *Once upon a time*. How does the writer increase the tension throughout this paragraph? Explain fully, referring to the text in your answer.'

The children are used to these types of questions through our Guided Reading sessions, home learning and undergoing practice type questions based on the SATS layouts

English Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling

The grammar, punctuation and spelling test will consist of two parts: a grammar and punctuation paper requiring short answers, lasting 45 minutes, and an aural spelling test of 20 words, lasting around 15 minutes.

The grammar and punctuation test will include two sub-types of questions:

- Selected response, e.g. 'Identify the adjectives in the sentence below'
- **Constructed response,** e.g. 'Correct/complete/rewrite the sentence below,' or, 'The sentence below has an apostrophe missing. Explain why it needs an apostrophe.'

Maths

Children will sit three papers in maths:

- Paper 1: arithmetic, 30 minutes
- Papers 2 and 3: **reasoning**, 40 minutes per paper

Paper I will consist of fixed response questions, where children have to give the correct answer to calculations, including long multiplication and division. Papers 2 and 3 will involve a number of question types, including:

- Multiple choice
- True or false
- Constrained questions, e.g. giving the answer to a calculation, drawing a shape or completing a table or chart
- Less constrained questions, where children will have to explain their approach for solving a problem

Writing

The teachers and Senior Leadership Team will also teacher assesses your child's writing to determine whether there is evidence they are working at the expected standard.
