# Admission of 3 and 4 Year Olds to Froglets – September 2017



Camden is introducing some new policy this year which will affect free nursery places in Camden.


- 1. The first is a new offer of 30 hours' free early education for working parents who meet certain criteria:
  - both parents, or the sole parent in a one parent family, must be working
  - each parent must have a weekly minimum income equivalent to 16 hours at the national minimum wage or living wage, and
  - •neither parent must have income of more than £100,000 per year.

Historically, Camden have funded 30 hours of nursery education but this is changing from September.

All three and four year olds will remain entitled to 15 hours of free early education (15 hours a week for 38 weeks, up to the total of 570 hours).

This means the Camden 'enhanced offer' of 30 hours for all three and four year olds in school and Council-run nurseries will need to change.



# Admission of 2 Year Olds to Tadpoles – April 2017

The 2 Year Old Provision will open in April 2017.

This will be a space for 12 children in the morning and 12 children in the afternoon – in the first instance.



## Eligibility

Your two year old can get free early education and childcare if you receive ONE of the following:

- Income support
- Income-based jobseeker's allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Universal Credit
- Tax credits and you have an annual income of under £16,190 before tax
- the guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Support through Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act
- The Working Tax Credit 4-Week Run On (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)



- They are looked after by a local council
- They have a current statement of Special Educational Need (SEN) or an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHC)
- You receive Disability Living Allowance
- The child has left care under a special guardianship order, child arrangements order or adoption order.



## Eligibility



Places will be offered with the following school criteria applied:

- Children of an appropriate age to fill the vacancy to ensure the balance of places across the age range (terms of birth)
- Children with a sibling registered at the school
- Children living nearest to the school

You can tell Pauline that you are interested in a place at the school if you believe your child qualifies for a place. You will also need to make a formal application to Camden Council in order to confirm you meet the criteria. In the meantime, we will add you to our waiting list. #### Two year olds and entitlement

 Child becomes 2 before 1 September and parents work less or earn less than £16,190 p.a.

Child entitled to 15 hours free early education from beginning of Autum term until end of Summer term Child entitled to 15 hours free early education from beginning of Spring term until end of Autum term  Child becomes 2 before 1 January and parents workless or earn less than £16,190 p.a.

 Child becomes 2 before 1 April and parents work less or earn less than £16,190 p.a. Child entitled to 15 hours free early education from beginning of Summer term until end of Spring term

Child becomes entitled to 3YO offer in Autumn, Spring or Summer Term
