tific enquiry skills with parents. Guided by our scientific Year 1 parents, Reception had a wonderful time at a special forest school session with Jane Worroll and Butterflies and Dragonflies learnt all about neuroscience, working with Dr. Ivana Drobnjak from UCL. Thank you to UCS and the Francis

#### Mental Health Work Development at Chickens Primrose Hill Quite a lot of work around the mental health agenda

has been taking place at Primrose Hill over the past year. This has been led by Mandy and Syra but also involving a number of key staff in school. Our Governing Body appointed Isabel Murphy as the Link Governor to report on mental health work in the school and she has compiled some headlines for our

community so they know what has been going on:

- We have a named Inclusion Lead for Social, Emotional and Mental Health (Mandy Aplicano)
- Involvement in the Camden Working Party on Mental Health Provision
- Whole staff INSET training on managing Mental Health difficulties

Implementation of a Mental Health Policy

- Art therapy and music therapy
- Robust procedures for identifying vulnerable / at risk children this is done in inclusion surgeries and pupil progress reviews
- Behaviour support plans
- Strengths and difficulties questionnaire for children

Worry boxes in each class with named adult template. Giving children an opportunity to seek help early on.

- Nurture groups in KSI and KS2
- Whole class resilience programme in KS2
- Group and individual interventions: Talk about, Circle of friends , Lego therapy

Emotional literacy support assistant leading a KS2 lunch club, KSI lunch club

- Skills for life: one to one mentoring •
- Friendship squad •
- Circle times .

Through PSHCE (personal, social, health and citizenship education) teaching emotional and social skills

- Making referrals to services when needed such as CAMHS who provide I-I and group therapies
- Mental health and resilience leaflets

Staff mental health breakfasts / time to talk day IMHAR ( Islington mental health and resilience in schools) looking at staff well being
