Two Year Old Provision - September

We are now filling our places for the two year old provision for September. If you are eligible for a Camden funded 15 hour place, as follows, please speak to Ilirjana.

There are certain eligibility criteria for admissions:

Your two year old can get free early education and childcare if you receive ONE of the following:

- Income support
- Income-based jobseeker's allowance (ISA)
- · Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- · Universal Credit
- Tax credits and you have an annual income of under £16,190 before tax
- the guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Support through Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act
- The Working Tax Credit 4-Week Run On (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

A child can also get free early education and childcare if any of the following apply:

- They are looked after by a local council
- They have a current statement of Special Educational Need (SEN) or an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHC)
- You receive Disability Living Allowance
- The child has left care under a special guardianship order, child arrangements order or adoption order.

Places will be offered with the following criteria applied:

- Children of an appropriate age to fill the vacancy to ensure the balance of places across the age range (terms of birth)
- Children with a sibling already registered at Primrose Hill Primary School
 - Children living nearest to the school


