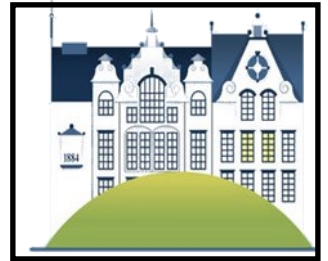

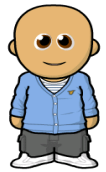

This year its on the 1st of July and we are super eggcited, we shake a tail feather every time we think about it.

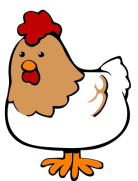
Coincidentally, its at the same time as your summer fair at school!

Attendance & Punctuality

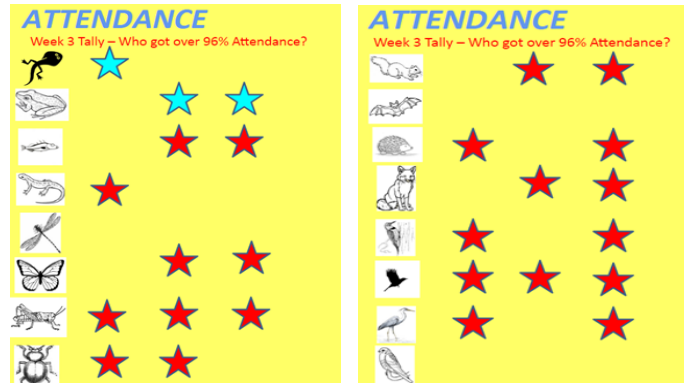
This week's attendance has improved - Well done!
