# Door Security



We have had some additional door controls installed across the school. These are located at the end of corridors and stairwells throughout the school, similar to the one you use to enter and exit the building and lobby/ main corridor area. This is to provide some additional inside the building and to prevent free movement before

safety once inside the building, and to prevent free movement before and after school as well as during a lockdown if necessary. The new door controls will be in operation for most of the day but will be deactivated before school and at drop off, during break and lunchtimes and after school until 4pm. At all other times, the doors will be 'live'. We have planned for other eventualities that may occur in a normal working day. All doors would be deactivated automatically during a fire evacuation. We may experience some teething problems over the next few days, which of course is to be expected, but believe the system will be really useful and effective once fully up and running.




#### The Friends of Primrose Hill School
