You may have heard lots in the media about GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation). This affects all businesses and organisations from 25th May 2018 and refers to the data that is held about the children, families and staff etc. All primary schools are being supported by Camden in implementing the new requirements. For schools this includes having a new GDPR Policy and a privacy statement (drafts already created on our website). GDPR affects pupil records, transfer of information to new schools, how records are stored etc. Most of our data is kept on our secure school management system – Integris. GDPR for schools is nothing to worry about, but just to keep you informed of the changes ahead.
