We would like to send more correspondence by email next year rather than in actual paper form. If you could provide an updated email to the office, that would be helpful.



interactive website called Table Fables, which aims to help children learn and remember their number and times tables in an innovative and fun way. The site is very easy to use and the learning is done via number stories with visual hooks to help remember the facts.

Children in the current Reception, Year I and 2 have had a mini introductory session last week on how to use the site and meet the number character. The children seemed to really enjoy it. Next week letters will be sent to parents with individual logins so the children can access it over the summer holidays. This will help support with retaining important number facts over the long holiday period. The login details will be set up with next academic year's classes and year group. This recourse will be used alongside class teaching of the times tables, so that children have understood concepts before using the site to help memorise facts.
