Autism Inclusion Hub



Camden has an increasing number of children assessed with Autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and require some additional resourced provisions within the borough at both primary and secondary level at mainstream schools. Primrose Hill Primary School has been selected for consideration to have an Autistic Inclusion Hub at the School. This would mean to create a existing space within the school for 14 additional children who would be taught within the space, but also integrated into the mainstream school. This is at a very early point of development, but an exciting one as we already support a wide range of children with additional educational needs, many of whom have Autism, and this would enhance the work we already do. More detailed proposals will go to the Governing Body later this month who have already been involved in early discussions. Then we move to a consultation period where you can hear more information about the plans and have the opportunity to contribute. We will also be putting information on our website and on display within the building, but this is just an early heads up about the plans. There is some information outside Robin's Office so watch this space!
