


Phase 1



Phase 2

The purpose of this phase is to teach letters. A phoneme is the smallest sound that the letter makes. A grapheme is the written letter that represents the sound in a word.

They will also learn to read some high-frequency 'tricky' words. Tricky word is a word that cannot be sounded out, it must just be learnt. Words such as I, the, go, no

By the end of the phase children should be able to read some simple words.

Phase 3

- The purpose of this phase is to teach another 25 graphemes, most of them comprising two letters (e.g. oa)
- A digraph is two letters that make one sound (e.g. 'sh' in ship/ fish)
- A trigraph is three letters that make one sound (e.g. 'igh' in light)
- Children also continue to practise CVC blending and segmentation and will apply their knowledge of blending and segmenting to reading and spelling simple two-syllable words and captions.
