## Children's Birthdays






## Email Services

### Reception Admission

Where and how do I apply?

Camden Council co-ordinates primary reception admissions for community, voluntary aided, free schools and academies.

- To apply for a reception class place for the 2020-21 school year, your child must be born between I September 2015 and 31 August 2016.
- The deadline for applications is 15 January 2020. If you miss this date, your child is unlikely to receive an offer until after the first round of offers in April.
- If you live in Camden, your application will be managed by Camden Council - but you can apply for schools in any borough.
- If your address is not in Camden, apply to the local authority for
- You can name up to six schools in your preferences. We recommend that you use all your six preferences.
- You can apply for a place at any community school, voluntary aided school, academy or free school
- Camden cannot offer places at independent (private) schools. You must apply directly to these schools.
