## Attendance

I will be writing to parents whose children's attendance has fallen below 90%. If your child has 90% attendance in a year, it means they have missed 20 days absence! This is four weeks of school. If it drops to 85%, then this is 30 days – six weeks of school time. This has a direct impact on learning, what children miss and their confidence in coming to school knowing they have missed lots of work.

100% Day is coming back! All classes with 100% attendance on 12th March will have 10 mins of extra play. We're going to be promoting this throughout school until then so keep it in your diaries.

We've updated the attendance board so children can keep up with who is in the lead to win the prizes, but for now..

I would like to congratulate you, your staff and your pupils on the very high level of progress that pupils in your school demonstrated in the reading, writing and mathematics Key Stage 2 assessments last year.

Your school's results, as published on 13 December, show progress scores of 5.5, 2.9 and 5.7 in reading, writing and mathematics respectively. This means that in terms of the progress your pupils make between Key Stage 1 and the end of Key Stage 2, your school is amongst the top 3 per cent of primary schools in the country.
