Cooking and healthy eating

We cook every week with the children and ask for a **voluntary contribution of 50p a week** to buy the ingredients and resources needed. Your child can give it to a member of staff in the classroom or if you prefer you can contribute for the half term or term in one go.

And finally...



A reminder that our aim is for your child to become a confident, motivated and independent learner. Remind them to 'have a go' at things they find difficult. We encourage the children to use their words to explain what's up or to have a turn with a toy that someone else is using, for example, 'can I have a turn please?' Try to refrain from doing things for them and tell them 'you can do it' (wiping nose with tissue for example or pulling trousers up and down to use the toilet).

Praise all of your child's successes and encourage them to make decisions and choices about the experiences and learning they do outside of school.
