#### Covid 19

You will have seen various updates regarding the developments with the Corona Virus. We receive regular updates from Camden and Public Health and the DFE and acts upon these as appropriate. There will be daily updates on the website as information comes in. Until any further measures are announced, our main focus is in ensuring good habits of hygiene to minimise any spread of infection. This mainly entails:

- Good regular handwashing habits and teaching children the 20 second rule
- Proper use of tissues for sneezing or blowing noses and then disposing of these in a bin

We have also been looking to the future and drawing up contingency plans. We will endeavour to keep the school open in the event of multiple staff absences, however this may involve introducing precautionary measures such as cancelling trips or clubs, requiring children to bring packed lunch, splitting or combining classes and avoiding large gatherings such as class assemblies etc. We would plan for these if issues arise.

We hope the above will not be needed, however we feel it is important to inform you of actions which may need to be taken.

I have also put some planning in place for what would happen if all schools had to close. This would be communicated with you if that eventuality occurs. Please note the school will only close if directed to do so by Public Health England.


## Attendance
