### Virtual Meeting

After some trials with a few classes, your child's class teacher is going to be in touch to set up a

google meet — a kind of group call — where the children and teacher can interact. We have had a session together as a staff to plan for this and will probably do it in small groups just to provide some face to face for the children and for them to see each other, managed by the teacher! We have agreed to try this in each class, including EYFS in some way before half term. There is no expectation for your child to take part if you don't think it is appropriate, but we think it will be a nice way of bringing everyone together. If you prefer not to take part, just raise it with your child's class teacher when they post online next week. Prior to the session, we will post next week some google meet etiquette.

### 30 Hours Funding for 3-4 year olds Summer Term flexibility

We have received notification from the Government that there is to be some flexibility with the 30 hour extended entitlement where any working parent usually eligible for 30 hours free childcare or Tax-Free Childcare will remain eligible if they fall below the minimum income requirement due to COVID19. Subject to Parliamentary approval, parents who are critical workers will also remain eligible for these entitlement if their income has increased over the £100k threshold during COVID19.

Parents are required to reconfirm their eligibility in the usual way, however the 30 hour deadline for the summer term has been extended to 31st August in order to give working parents additional time to protect their place. Parents should visit www.childcarechoices.gov.uk in order to apply for a 30 hour code and Tax-Free Childcare.

Camden also have been given authority to extend the validity dates on the 30 hour codes for parents who are **critical workers** during the summer term, ensuring those who are eligible can access the childcare despite having missed their reconfirmation date of 31st March 2020.




Mental Health Awareness Week 18th - 24th May 2020 This years theme is 'kindness'

In Year 2 we have been using our imaginations to create our own story characters. We'll be using them in our story writing next week so watch this space!




