Step 1

Starter: Who would you ask?



Discuss (2-3 mins)

Discuss with your partner. Who would you ask for help if...

You needed help with your school work?



Someone was being mean to you?

Had a bad dream at night?



You got lost in a supermarket?



Saw something scary on the internet?



You were worried about a friend?

Challenge:

Would you want these people to help you? What if they said no?

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Why are we talking about this?



Right now, there are a lot of people protesting in America because they don't think black people are being treated fairly.

Lots of people around the world are also speaking out online and in protests to support them, even if it doesn't affect them.



But should you stand up for other people? Or is it better to leave it to other/older people? That's what you'll be thinking about today.



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Should I get involved?



A girl in my class is in a wheelchair and can't get up the stairs. She's asked everyone to sign a petition to get a ramp in school. I don't have a wheelchair, but should I sign the petition?

No, she shouldn't!

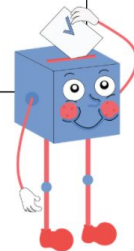


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Should you **stand up** for other people?

It's more important to stand up for things that affect me. There are other, more helpful things you could do. It's safer if I don't get involved in our people's problems.
