


STORY AND ACTIVITY

Number of the week: BBC iPlayer - Numberblocks - Series 1: Stampolines Focus on key vocab: more, less, altogether, the same as, because, I can see Using a piece of string / ribbon - create a washing line, and then either draw a different number of objects on small pieces of paper or cut a different number of objects out of a newspaper / magazine. Hide these around the house for your
