# **Healthy School Street**

Camden are creating a Healthy School Street on Princess Road to assist with social distancing at school drop off and pick up times, and to encourage walking/cycling/scooting to school

- This will reduce traffic volumes on Princess Road during the school drop off and pick up times, making it safer for pedestrians, cyclists, pupils and parents/carers travelling to/from Primrose Hill School
- The Healthy School Street will launch at the beginning of the new school term in September 2020

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#### What will the work involve?

The changes Camden will be making on Princess Road in time for the new school term in September are as follows:

- Creating a "timed" Healthy School Street road closure on Princess Road (see times of operation below), between Gloucester Avenue and Chalcot Road. This will improve safety for local residents and those parents and children accessing Primrose Hill School, by preventing vehicles from entering Princess Road at school drop off and pick up times.
- Installing relevant signage to alert drivers of the restriction, and Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras at the junction with Gloucester Avenue and at the junction with Chalcot Road. The signage will state that the road closure to all motor vehicle traffic (except exemptions see below) will operate Monday-Friday with times 8:15–9:30am and 3-4pm. The signs will be closed during school holidays as the scheme will operate in school term time only.
- Removal of guard railing outside the school to help enable social distancing.
