Big Building Jobs Done

Maintaining a building which is over 130 years old is not easy, but there have been substantial changes over the past five years:

- Building and launching a two year old provision the Tadpoles. I was keen on developing this for Camden, as long as they were able to throw us some more cash for facilities. This resulted in the creation of a new super classroom and the removal of some terrible children and staff toilets and a covered, dark and dingy play area.
- Renovation of the windows
- Replacement of the boiler and gas and radiators
- All water pipes
- New electricity circuit boards
- Speaker installation
- Wi-Fi upgrade
- Getting funding to create our Autistic Resourced Provision The Grove. This brought nearly half a million pound of investment into the school, creating resources for our children, attracting new families, building new toilets, garden areas.
- Development of the outside learning spaces creating an outside classroom for Reception and YI children, developing KSI and KS2 playground facilities and a beautiful garden
- Decorating the lobby with new paint, carpet and furniture
- Painting the communal hallways
- Refurbishing all the staff toilets and all but one children's toilet blocks
- Renovation of the library
- Mosaic Project...my legacy to you. Each class / group will be immortalised in mosaic for ever more

With cases of coronavirus rising rapidly across much of London, yesterday (Wednesday 16 December) London moved to Tier 3 – a 'very high' level of local COVID alert. Restrictions now include:

Reporting positive cases to the school during the Holiday

Thank you for your ongoing cooperation this school year as we continue to respond to the challenges of COVID-19.
