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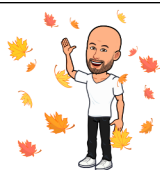

Just a gentle reminder that medical appointments must be made outside of school hours as these affect your child's attendance. Thanks all, Lyra.

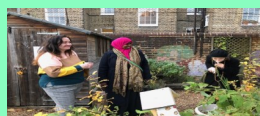


Good as Gold
