Risk Assessment

We have been looking through the Government and Union Guidelines to ensure our Risk Assessment is comprehensive most protocols and procedures are the same, with a few new additions, of which highlights include:

* face masks being worn by all adults in communal areas and we are strongly advising staff to wear them when they can not socially distance from children. This of course depends on the age of the child and the child's individual needs.

ventilation- this continues to be key in minimising the transmission of COVID. We have put in new extra measures for monitoring this such as buying a CO2 monitor, extra ventilation for classrooms throughout the day and in the dining hall. will continue to ensure sanitisation, washing hands and cleaning equipment etc. is a priority.

Face Masks

We continue to ask all parents and carers to wear face masks



when they are in and around the school building and when they are dropping and collecting their child/ren.

The guidance still suggests that children under the age of 11 do not need to wear face masks, however we know that some parents would like to make the choice for their child's safety to wear them in school.

We are happy for parents to make this individual choice, but please be advised that staff will not be able to monitor the children who wear them and will not enforce this during the school day, it will be the responsibility of the child themselves, after having guidance from you as their parents/carers.

Please read the government guidance on wearing face masks:

- FACE MASK ADVICE (including for children who choose to wear them)
- Not touch the front of their face covering during use or when removing it
- Dispose of temporary face coverings in a 'black bag' waste bin (not recycling bin)
- Place reusable face coverings in a plastic bag they can take home with them
- Wash their hands again before heading to their classroom or before doffing and donning
- For adults, shields or visors can only be worn IN ADDITION to face masks.
- Face masks should not be worn when damp

Keeping our Community Safe

Please check your child for symptoms, and **do not** come in to school if they or **anyone in your family** show the following symptoms: Remember, everyone in your household will have to isolate if anyone has one of these symptoms & you will need to arrange a COVID test:

• a high temperature (please try to take their temperature

- every morning/check if they are hot to touch on chest & back)a new, continuous cough or symptoms this means coughing
- a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours

• a loss or change to sense of smell or taste – this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

The above 3 symptoms are from the NHS and you should always consult your GP or call 111 NHS or use the coronavirus service https://111.nhs.uk/covid-19/

What to do if you have symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

- I. Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible.
- **2.** Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get your test result only leave your home to have a test.
- **3.** Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also stay at home until you get your result.
