Welcome Back! We hope you and your child/ren had a restful and enjoyable Easter holiday. We are looking forward to our last term together and have planned many exciting activities.

Punctuality & Attendance

It continues to be really important that children arrive and are collected promptly according to the timings below to support social distancing and to keep everyone as safe as possible. A reminder that adults and carers should be wearing a mask when collecting their child.

Curriculum Overview:

We will continue to adapt the curriculum this half term and beyond to meet the needs of our learners - whilst ensuring it remains broad and balanced. Our topic this half term is 'Life Cycles' and we are focusing on the stories 'Jasper's Beanstalk' and 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'.

In phonics, we have started to teach phase 2 sounds (s,a,t,p,i,n). This half term, we will be continuing with (m,d,g,o,c,k,ck). There will also be a focus on recognising, reading and writing their name.

Reading

We are continuing with a reading day every week and your child will bring home 2 new books to share each week. Your child's reading day is Tuesday.

If you haven't already bought a book bag these can be purchased from the office for £3.50. You will see inside their book bag your child's reading diary. Please take time to share it with them and support them to evaluate their experience by colouring in the smiley face. They will be rewarded with a stamp

the following week if they have done this. There is also a space for you to share your own thoughts/comments and the adults in class will respond.

Please continue to use **Reading Eggs** at home to support your child with reading and access to a wider variety of books. If you have any questions please feel free to come and speak to one of us.

Toys at school

Please remind your child that we discourage them from bringing in their own toys to school.

Water and fruit

We provide fruit for the children, though each child will need their own **named bottle of water** each day. We will be able to refill them when needed.

Healthy Eating/Malleable Play

Cooking with children offers a wide variety of learning experiences, for example Numeracy, Communication and Language, Understanding the World and Physical Development can all be taught in one cooking session. To help support this, we ask for a voluntary contribution of **50p** a week, where we will be able to buy the ingredients and resources needed. We will place a donation jar outside the classroom, or if you prefer, this adds up to £3.50 over the half term, where you can make your contribution in one go rather than finding coins each week. We really appreciate your support, thank you!

As we become gardeners this term with our life cycles/growing theme, we will be doing lots of planting and growing. If you have any spare soil, seeds, saplings or gardening tools you could spare, we would be extremely grateful for any donations. We will also be using the 50p contributions towards this.

Dressing for school

It is really important during these Summer months that your child is wearing suitable clothing. Please dress your child in clothes that are practical for the classroom and ensure your child's clothing is named. The children spend a lot of time in Nursery outdoors so please make sure they have a named sunhat on warmer days. We are also very lucky to have our new mud kitchen. If you have any spare wellie boots at home that you don't need any more, we can add them to our collection. There are times the children have accidents or get dirty or wet so please leave a change of clothing on their peg.

Please apply sunscreen to your child **before** they come to school in the morning. We cannot apply sunscreen to your child and they are not able to do it themselves.

As part of our safety precautions in school, we are keeping the windows and doors open in our classroom to ensure the room is ventilated.
