What is mindset?

Growth Mindset

Research shows that there are different beliefs about ability:

- Fixed Mindset: intelligence is fixed and it can't be changed; give up easily; failure or mistakes is proof that they are 'no good at maths' or are 'rubbish at writing.'
- Growth Mindset: ability and intelligence can be developed through effort, persistence and learning from mistakes; bounce back from difficulties because failure or mistakes are part of improving and learning.

At Primrose Hill, we believe every child is capable of learning anything; we are a Growth Mindset School. The Growth Mindset principles support and develop metacognition and help children remember more.

We believe that the best thing to do is to teach children to love challenges, be intrigued by mistakes, enjoy the effort, and keep on learning. For children who find work easy, we make sure that they encounter more difficult tasks. I noticed our children recognise and value the importance of effort, persistence and embrace their mistakes as part of the learning process as what helps them improve. Our teachers modelled this during training session delivered by Jemma (one of our Y5 teachers) where she set everyone problem solving exercise. I noticed how the staff were thinking critically, appling their mathematical skills, working collaboratively and were persistent till they solved the problem on the right.



The children are rewarded for effort as well as outcome and are encouraged to challenge themselves. There is no ceiling for their learning and all children are encouraged to try, even when they feel stuck. Indeed, being 'stuck' is seen as an important part of the learning process.

I want to introduce you to another person that inspired me, Dr Carol Dweck. https://youtu.be/hiiEeMN7vbQ. Carol Dweck's theory are embedded in the school ethos and the staff and children relish challenges, embrace mistakes as part of the learning process, value effort, respond carefully to feedback and take inspiration from others.

Think of some brilliant people - now think about their route to becoming brilliant. Did this happen overnight or because they worked really, really hard at it?

We hope to continue to create a culture of aspiration, determination and resilience. Boost motivation and achievement = SUCCESS.


