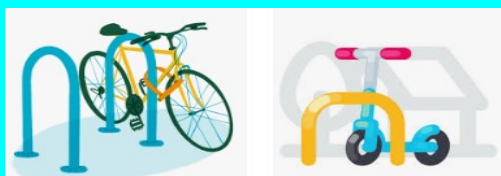
Scooters and Bikes
