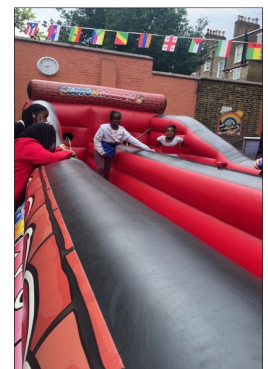
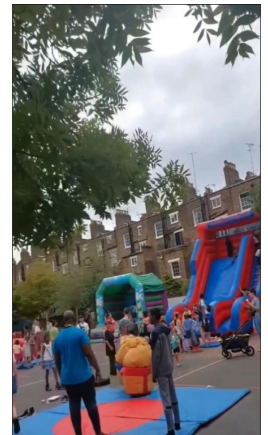


The Summer Fair


This week we have been enjoying a sensory story called 'Here Comes the Train'. The pupils showed excellent participation and listening skills.

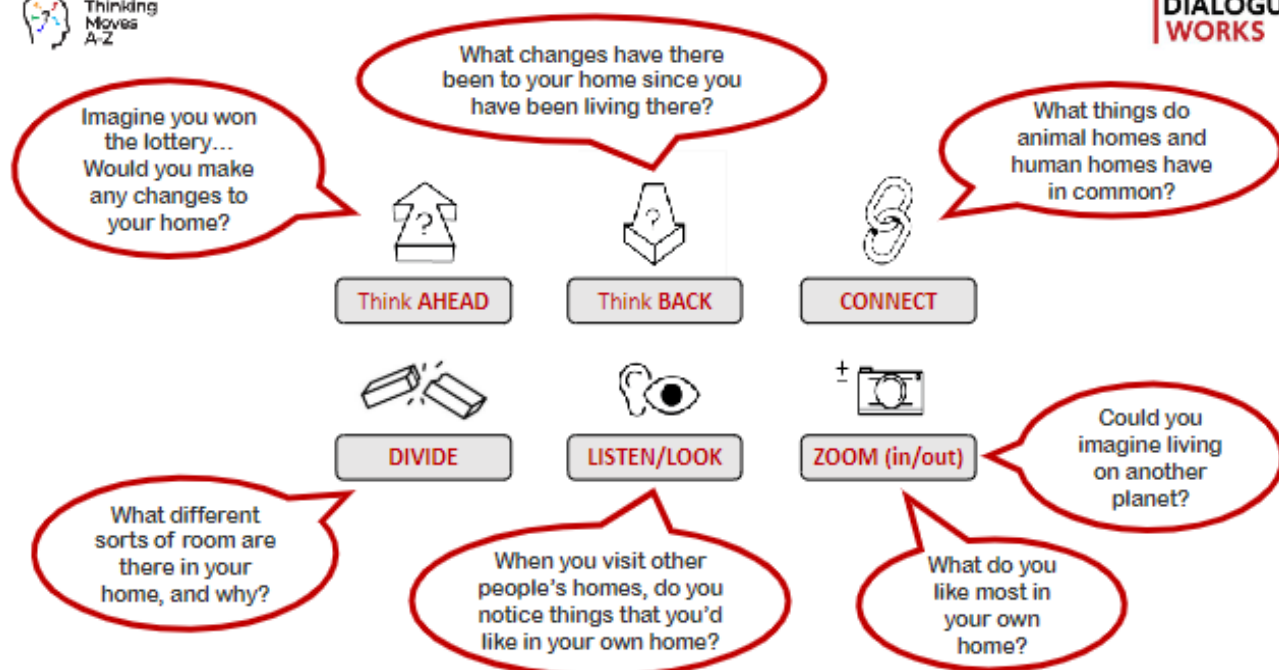
