

Nursery Admissions for September 2024 Start

Please note that the deadline for an application is on **Thursday 15 February 2024 for September 2024** start in our Nursery (Froglets) and our two-year-old provision (Tadpoles). Children who are currently attending our two-year-old provision **must reapply** to enter Nursery.

Please submit a completed application form together with the required supporting documents: a birth certificate, a council tax bill, a utility bill and if applicable, an evidence of eligible funding or any special needs. We would like to request for an up-to-date council tax bill and utility bill (up to 6 months) if the applicant is considered new to school.

15 & 30 hours free childcare for 3 and 4-year-olds

- All 3 to 4-year-olds in England can get 570 free hours per year. It's usually taken as 15 hours a week for 38 weeks of the year, but you can choose to take fewer hours over more weeks, for example.
- Some 3 to 4-year-olds are eligible for 30 hours free childcare a week. Check if you're eligible and find out how to apply.
- You must live in England to apply for free childcare. The amount of free childcare you can get depends on:
- your child's age and circumstances
- whether you're working (employed, self-employed, or a director)
- your income (and your partner's income, if you have one)
- your immigration status
- If you've already registered, you can sign in to your childcare account.



15 hours free childcare for 2-year-olds

How to claim 15 hours free childcare including where to get your code

- Applications are now open for eligible working parents of 2-year-olds to receive 15 hours free childcare, starting from April 2024.
- It's the first step in our promise to expand the 30 hours free childcare scheme for working parents from when their child turns nine months until they start school.
- We're making the biggest investment by a UK government into childcare in history, doubling the amount we expect to spend over the next few years from around £4 billion to around £8 billion each year.



How do I apply for 2 Year-Old Free 15 hours?

- You need to meet lour <u>eligibility criteria</u> before you can claim 15 hours free childcare.
- You apply online here on <u>Gov.uk</u>.
- You'll need to make sure you have the following information to hand before starting the application:
- your national insurance number (or unique taxpayer reference if you are self-employed)
- the date you started or are due to start work
- details of any government support or benefits you receive
- the UK birth certificate reference number (if you have one) for your child.
- You may find out if you're eligible straight away, but it can take up to 7 days.
- Once your application has been approved, you'll get a code for free childcare to give to your childcare provider.
- Applications are open from now until 31 March. If you miss the deadline, or don't receive your code by 31 March, you won't be able to start using the new entitlements from 1 April.
